1—Do I see to it that my plants secure fresh, pure air every day?

This is accomplished by airing the from thoroughly daily, being care ful to open a window or door, how ever, that will not allow a direct draft to blow on the plants.

2—Is the temperature too high.

This is unhealthful for your family as well as your plants. A temperature above 10 degrees is not conductive to good plant growth.

3—Am I using some means of maintaining a moist, humid atmospher?
