## Suburban Building

Neither the business slump nor the seasonal failing off had any great effect on the amount of the permits for building issued in November in the Chicago suburban region. Sitty-four communities reported a total of \$2,985,546 to the Greenebaum —lavestiment Company, which makes a monthly survey of the area. This compares with \$3,239,522 for October, 1937, and \$2,056,449 for November of and \$3,006,949 for November of last year, a total which was great-ly enlarged by the inclusion of a \$750,000 addition to the disease en-gine plant at McCook. As almost no industrial construction is found in the latest reports to offset this extraordinary item, it is apparent that suburban building in general is well shade of last was
