#### "BUSINESS AND LABOR"

Robert Louis Stevenson once said that we live not by ad alone but principally by catchwords. It does seem true that in our time we are making certain words and phrases

that in our time we are making certain words and phrases carry more weight than is good for them.

Consider the word combination: "business and labor."

Almost daily we hear this phrase used as if to lave one were to hate the other. We often hear about public officials "lean-ing toward labor" or "making overtures to business." Most of us know what is generally meant by these phrases, yet to many they tend to set up an antagonism that does not really exist.

One need not think very deeply to understand that the resis of labor and business—that is to say, the employer—identical; that in the long run their interests do coincide because they are both parts of the same body politic. What hurts one hurts the other; what is good for one is also good

We need to be wary of such abstractions that set up tion between these common interests, lest the phrase turn into a battle cry.
