

"Everybody Sing" Is Week-End Bill at Catlow Theatre

"The Big Broadcast of 1938,"
With W. C. Fields, to
Open Wednesday

A sound crew was at Coarse Gold, Madera county, recently on the most unusual enterprise in the history of Hollywood. The crew was recording coyote howls for "Gold Is Where You Find It," the melodrama now showing at the Catlow Theatre, with George Brent and Olivia de Havilland as its stars. The sound track of the weird howling of the coyotes was to be used as a background for several of the out-door sequences in the picture, which was filed in technicolor. It will also be turned over to the Warner Bros. music department for when the musical score is written.

Because Stuart Erwin likes to have the last word, Jane Withers' newest starring film, "Checkers," has a good many more laughs than the script writers put into it. Most of Judy's education was received in Los Angeles, but she did a great deal of traveling due to the fact that she was a member of the Garland Sisters act which was composed of Judy, Suzanne and Virginia. When Suzanne married the act broke up and it was then that Judy came to Hollywood and talked the studio executives into giving her a job.

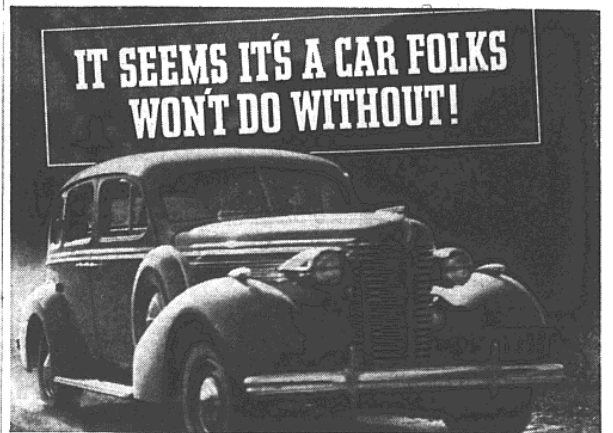

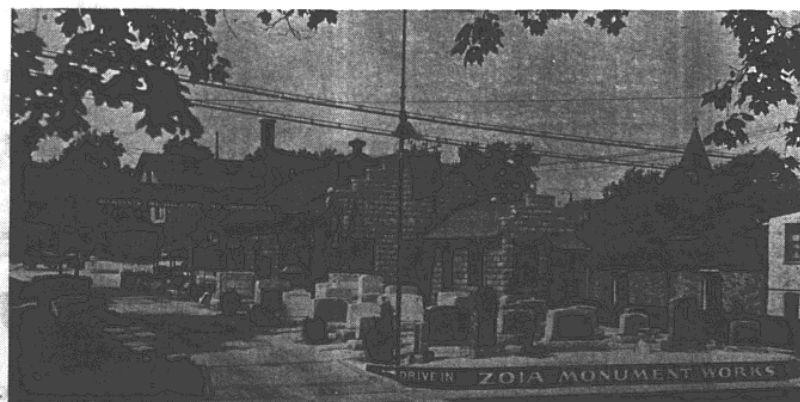
