Jr. High Observes

Arbor Day Friday

Following a plan prepared three years ago, Barrington Junior high school will observe Arbor Day by planting a tree for each grade at Northside park Friday afternoon. Appropriate programs will include tree poems and songs and the placing of sealed bottles containing all pupils' names beneath the roots of the trees.

In the spring of 1935 the Barrington park board approved a plan, presented by Willard M. Watson of the Junior high, whereby the pupils might have the opportunity to aid in the tree planting at Northside park. It was suggested that they attempt to widen the variety of trees found there and this has been the aim of those who selected the specimens each year.

Including the three to be planted this Arbor Day there will be 13 sturdy trees lending their beauty and shade to the park, through the efforts of local Junior high boys and girls. The financing has been accomplished through plays, candy sales, auctions, and musical programs, all of which were pupils managed.

It is hoped that this plan may include other grades in future years, thus giving more children a feeling of accomplishment in the "plant a tree" campaign. A list of the trees includes: 1935—Blue spruce, pin oak, hackberry; 1934—redwood, Chinese elm, lamarck, ginkgo; 1933—Japanese flowering crab, hawthorne, ironwood; 1932—honey locust, weeping willow, Ohio buckeye.
