Fork, Rake, Hoe Are Only Tools Needed for Small Gardens

A spading fork, a rake and a hoe are about the only tools the backyard gardener needs, says B. L. Weaver, of the department of horticulture, college of agriculture, University of Illinois.

With these tools it is possible to work the entire area of a small garden, leaving no waste space at the sides and ends. It the garden is fenced, some crops such as late pees, pole beans, tomatoes or cu-cumbers may be planted or set-close to the fence and he supported by the fence itself, Weaver explain-tid.

In a small garden it is impor-tant to utilize all the available space throughout the season. By planning the garden in advance and using companion and succes-sion plantings, two or three crops may be grown on the same ground the same mason.

For example radishes need not be planted in separate rows, but may be used to mark the rows of seet quiens or paranips. They make possible early cultivation, and in the control of weeds and reputled before damage has been done to their companion crop. Early planting of peas may be followed by string beans which are removed to make room for kelp, except the companion crop.
