

Niles Center Trojans Trounce Bronchos Here Thursday, 29 to 21

Eby and Rork Lead Attack for Niles; Ponies Also Lose

Local Cagers Suffer Second Conference Defeat; Meet Leyden Next

In a more one-sided battle than in previous games, the Niles Center Trojans lost to the Bronchos of Niles Center here Thursday night by the score of 29-21. The Bronchos were less accurate and seemed to have less drive than usual. Eby and Rork led the Trojan attack, the former making seven points and the latter ten. Niles went into the second quarter with a 6-4 advantage, but during this period the Bronchos put on a spurt and at the half led by one point, 12-12.

The second half, however, was all in favor of the visitors. Led by Rork and Eby, Niles was ahead at the end of the third frame, 22-16, and retained this substantial margin to the end of the game, coming out on top, 29-21. The Bronchos have a game with Ebyden here on December 31, but after this there is no more basketball until 1939.

Indoor Field Trials Will Feature Sports Exhibits in Chicago

With the Isaac Walton League, federal and state conservation departments and associations interested in the preservation of American forests, the prevention of soil erosion and the protection of wild animal, bird, fish and plant life sponsoring exhibits and working for its success, the International Outdoor Sportsmen's show will be held January 21 to 29, in the International amphitheatre in Chicago.

Among the outstanding features of this major exposition will be the introduction in the Chicago district for the first time of indoor ski-jumping. Anders Haugen, world champion ski-jumper, and his associates will give exhibitions twice daily on a ski scaffold which will tower 35 feet from the floor and extend 215 feet into the main arena of the huge exposition building.

Other features announced for the central arena, where seals will be available for more than 10,000, are retrieving dog trials, ball and fly casting tournaments, pistol and rifle shooting contests, table tennis, badminton, wood chopping, log-sawing, horse show pitching and a series of spectacular water sports including log-rolling and canoe-tilting. A tank

70 feet long, 30 feet wide and four feet deep will be sunk for the retriever trials and water events.

There will be a bench show for sporting dogs and a puppy show. Entries are promised in record numbers for the indoor retriever trials in which the best hunting dogs in America are expected to compete. Francis Hogan will bring his famous Labrador, English Springer spaniels and Golden retrievers from Barrington to the show for daily exhibitions.
