

# Methodists Score Third Victory in Church League Monday Night

## St. Paul Defeats St. Anne; Salems League Leaders

No Games Scheduled for Jan. 3; Will Resume Play January 9

St. Paul defeated St. Anne by a 20 to 16 score and Methodist beat St. Matthew, 21 to 19, in Monday's church league basketball games. It was St. Paul's second and Methodist's third win in four starts each. St. Anne made it a close game with St. Paul but Willie Alenburgh provided the winning margin by scoring 15 points, more than half his team's total. St. Paul led 7-5 at the first quarter, 10-8 at the half, 17-9 at three-quarters, and then St. Anne outscored its opponents 7 to 3 in the final period to make the game count 20 to 16. Methodist had too much speed for St. Matthew and gained an easy victory. Conn paced the winners with five baskets and three free throws for 13 points. After a two-all tie at the quarter Methodist led 15 to 5 at the half and 19-10 at the three-quarters.

There will be no church games next Monday because of a Week of Prayer service on that night. On January 9, the league will resume play with Salem playing St. Matthew and Baptist meeting St. Anne.
