

## Typewriting Speed Demonstration Held for School Classes

Barney Staper of Hawthorne, N. J., former world's amateur champion typist, gave a demonstration in typing for students in the typewriting classes of the Barrington high school Monday morning.

Mr. Staper's official record in the last international typewriting contest, held in Toronto, Canada, under the auspices of the Canadian national exhibition, was 138 words per minute for one hour's writing. His record at this contest was the best of his career. During the hour's writing he struck 45,773 keys, which gave him an average of nearly 12 keys for each of the 3600 seconds.

In his demonstrations Mr. Staper emphasized rhythm, concentration, correct posture, and lightning changes of paper. While typing one of the timed tests he carried on a conversation with the students and answered their questions. In one test he amazed his audience by reciting the states of

the Union and their capitals in less than a minute while typewriting at full speed.

Mr. Staper received his early education in Paterson, N. J. He is now making an educational tour, which is sponsored by the educational department of the Underwood Elliot Fisher company. William Bergmann of Waukegan is introducing Mr. Staper to the Barrington in this vicinity.

## Invoke Curfew Law in Elgin to Keep Young Boys Home

Marshal Joseph G. Huber, of the Elgin police department, is invoking a 21-year-old ordinance in an effort to enforce curfew laws on children of 14 years and under in Elgin. The city curfew ordinance, passed by the Elgin city council in 1907, was taken from the musty files and dusted off by Marshal Huber as he prepared an order to keep boys younger than 14 years off the streets.

He found it necessary to issue such an order, he stated, when he found young boys in taverns and other places late at night during the last few months. Orders to the contrary were disregarded, he continued.

The ordinance stipulates that boys younger than 14 are to remain off the street between the hours of 5:30 at night and 5 in the morning in winter months and 9 at night and 5 in the morning during the summer. Parents may be prosecuted if the order is not complied with, the ordinance permits.

## Police Hold Youth for Grove Holdup

With the arrest of Frank Nank of Chicago Sunday the holdup at the Larry Hand cottage near Fox River Grove last Wednesday night has been solved. Chicago police picked up Nank Sunday and found the Hand car stolen from the cottage in his possession.

Two revolvers and two wrist watches also taken from the Hand cottage were found in possession of Nank. The \$78 in money taken from the cottage has not been accounted for as yet.

Nank went to the Hand cottage Wednesday night after he had been drinking, according to reports. At the cottage he fired two shots at the caretaker, Joe Pfeiffer, when the latter was unable to furnish Nank with the keys to the Hand car.

Pfeiffer claims Nank searched the house after firing the two shots

and then departed in the car. The caretaker was of the opinion the keys were found in a bureau drawer in the cottage.

Henry A. Nalle, McHenry county sheriff, went to Chicago Monday and returned with Nank who is being arraigned to county court.
