Travel Sunday to Play West Chicago Baseball Outfit

Nine Misuses at Sycamore Are Responsible for Loss; Heitman Pitches

The Barrington baseball team suffered another defeat when they dropped a contest to the Sycamore ball club by a score of 7 to 2 at Sycamore Sunday. Al Heitman was on the mound for the local and only allowed seven hits but also errors on the part of his teammates had a great deal to do with the loss. Paulsen and Baade got the only hits off the pitching of Pershall, Paulsen getting a single and a double and Baade knocking out a three-bagger and a single. First baseman Mertz of Sycamore gathered three hits, one of which was good for four bases, to lead both teams in hitting.

Barrington scored their only runs in the eighth inning on two hits and a walk. Sycamore pounded out three hits and scored four runs in their half of the eighth.

Heitman pitched all the way for the locals as did Pershall for Sycamore.
