

Auto Crash Suit Is Settled for \$3700

Settlement of \$3700 in the litigation against Algerts S. Swanson of St. Charles was completed last

before a decision was to be handed down in the Lake county circuit court Wednesday. The action concerned an automobile accident which occurred last April 1 at the intersection of routes 59-A and 43 near Diamond Lake. Swanson had made a counter-claim of damages. Plaintiffs, who received the cash settlement, were: Dr. T. B. Childs of Glencoe, who had sued for \$3000; his daughter Adelaide, who sought \$5000; and Warren Buscher, a minor, whose personal injury claim was \$20,000.


