Fall Enrollment in Public School Will Be Started Tuesday

of rooms and payment of rental fees on September 6 and 7.

Following is the scale of rental fees payable in the primary and elementary departments:

Kindergarten, \$1.25; grades 1, 2 and 3, \$1.75; grades 4 and 5, \$2; grade 6, \$2.25.

The fee for the senior high school will be the same as last year, five dollars. This fee covers the rental of all textbooks, workbooks, padlocks, lockers, and ordinary school supplies with the exception of pens, pencils and gym suits. Student activity tickets will be included in this payment. These tickets, which were used for the first time in 1937-38, proved very successful. They will admit the students to approximately a dozen football and basketball games, the junior class play, the dramatics club play, the senior play, the six programs furnished by the University of Wisconsin extension division, and will include a year's subscription to the school paper, the Broncho.

The fee for junior high school will be \$4.25 and is similar to the plan used in senior high school. In addition to rental fees, an activity ticket will also go with the \$4.25. It is believed that in addition to junior high school athletic contests, the ticket will also include those contests of senior high school teams.

Senior high school pupils are asked to use the north door for entering and leaving the building. All other pupils will enter through the south and west doors.

The time schedule for regular classes is as follows: kindergarten, 9 to 11 and 1 to 3; grades 1, 2 and 3, 9 to 11:45 and 1 to 3; grades 4, 5 and 6, 9 to 12 and 1 to 3; junior and senior high school, 8:15 to 12:12; 1 to 3:12.

This is Mr. Sasman's first year as head of the school.

In addition to directing the school's activities, Mr. Sasman will teach the fifth, sixth and seventh grades.

Herbert Cadwell, a graduate of Northwestern university, is also an addition to the faculty. Last year he did part time work at the Country Day school but this year will give all his time to teaching the second, third, and fourth grades, physical education and manual training.

Other members of the teaching staff are: Miss Grace Bradshaw, graduate of the University of Chicago, kindergarten and physical education; Miss Verna Kumele, graduate of National college of Education, Evanston, first grade and music.

Mr. Sasman stated he expected a slight increase in enrollment this year, with approximately 45 or 50 children in attendance.

Classrooms Spread Out Over New Portion; Add to Curriculum

Major changes are planned for the Barrington public school system when classes will begin their sessions September 7. A re-classification of both grammar and high school will be made, according to E. S. Smith, superintendent of schools.

Kindergarten and grades 1, 2, and 3 will be known as the primary

department, grades 4, 5 and 6 are to be called the elementary department; 7th, 8th and 9th grades are to be junior high school and senior high school will consist of grades 10, 11 and 12.

The most important change is the grouping of grade 9, which was formerly the freshman class, with the junior high school group. With the completion of the new addition this fall, considerable additional classroom space is now available. A study hall will be
