

Barrington Bronchos Lose Conference Grid Opener to Warren, 7 to 0

Locals Travel to Crystal Lake for 2 Games Saturday

Thompson Scores Only Goal for Blue Devils in Close Contest Saturday

The Barrington Bronchos lost their first conference grid game of the season to Warren township high school Blue Devils at Northside park last Saturday afternoon by the close score of 7 to 0. Warren succeeded in pushing over its marker in the first quarter by a series of line plays, two offense penalties and a short pass, after a blocked punt had been recovered on Barrington's 45-yard line.

The Barrington goal was threatened on several other occasions but the maroon and white boys managed to hold in the shadow of their goal posts.

Coach Clark's boys were pitted against a heavier and more experienced team and found difficulty in getting started. Plays through the line were unsuccessful so a running and passing attack was adopted, not being any more fruitful.

Church, Broncho fullback, tossed seven passes during the game but only two were successful. Warren clicked on only one out of five passing attempts.

The Bronchos intercepted three passes while Warren took one of Barrington's heaves. From scrimmage, however, Warren out-shone Barrington and made 13 first downs to the locals' five.

Thompson and Zimmerman were the key men in the Warren backfield and it was their off tackle smashes and end sweeps that placed the ball deep in the local territory in the last of the first period. Two penalties placed the ball on Barrington's 2-yd. line and Thompson crashed the line for the touchdown. He also added the extra point.

Barrington's only scoring threat came in the closing minutes of the last period when Shepard intercepted a pass and went to Warren's 33-yard line before being brought down by Zimmerman.

Dowell was the outstanding Warren lineman while the play of Keith Kampert at left guard for Barrington provided the sparkle of the afternoon.

Locals Best "Old Timers" to Even Baseball Contests

Wipe Out Former Loss Sunday By Winning 7 to 6 Battle

Playing desperately in what may prove to be the last game of the season, the Barrington baseball team nipped out a close decision over the "old timers" team here Sunday afternoon, and won by a score of 7 to 6. A profusion of errors was responsible for the scoring of both teams, the locals being charged with seven and the "old-timers" being guilty of five.

After retiring the former greats in order in the first half of the first inning, Manager Behringer's crew started off in a great shape by scoring two runs in their half on one hit, two errors and a walk. W. Altenburg did the hurrying for the former color bearers while E. Altenburg was on the mound for the regular team.

Wichman scored the first run for the challengers in their half of the fourth inning. He stole second and came home on C. Berg's double, one of the two extra base

hits of the afternoon by his companions. The "old timers" temporarily went into the lead in the fifth by scoring two runs to make it 3 to 2. Schutt was safe as was W. Altenburg when Klopfenstein, covering second was charged with two errors. "Emmie" then set down Scherf and McGowan by the strike out route but Wichman was walked, filling the bases. A passed ball and a wild throw by Bjornberg allowed the two runs to score. They picked up another marker in the sixth when C. Berg was safe on Kraft's error and scored on Schutt's sacrifice fly.

Barrington bounced right back in its half of the fifth and got one run on three walks, one error and one passed ball. McCarthy reached first by the four ball route as did B. Condit. They immediately pulled the double steal. With E. Altenburg at bat, McCarthy was out trying to come home on a passed ball. Condit, however, reached the plate when the ball was again dropped. Altenburg in the meantime was on first by a walk and Eiters was safe on an error by C. Berg. Reich and Melners fanned to finish the inning.

Scherf made the score 5 to 3 in the first half of the seventh when he singled and came home on Bill Sheahan's double. Klopfenstein and J. Condit knotted the game up by scoring two runs for the Barrington team in its half of the seventh. Errors by Flock and Sheahan and a single pushed the runs across.

The regulars got a tally in the eighth to go into the lead by a

score of 6 to 5 when Melners walked, stole second, scampered to third on Sheahan's second error of the game and came home on Klopfenstein's single, his second hit of the game.

A desperate ninth inning rally got underway in the former "greats" half of the last stanza and netted one run to make the game all even. Scherf scored the marker when he was safe on Reich's error, moved to second while McGowan was flying out to deep center, stole third and came home when Wichman was safe on Baade's error.

The locals started off their half of the ninth in business-like fashion to score the winning run. B. Condit singled and went to third on E. Altenburg's sharp double. He then scored on Eiters' long fly to right field.

Willis Altenburg gave up 8 hits, walked five men, struck out five men and there were five errors committed behind him. E. Altenburg struck out 3 men, walked one, gave six hits and there were seven errors.

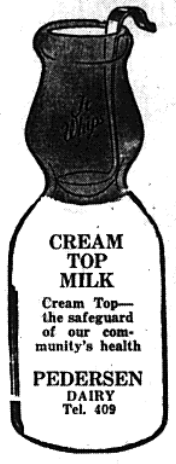
