MAKERLAB SPOTLIGHT: SUBLIMATION PRINTER

What is Sublimation?

Sublimation is the process of transferring full color images onto items made specifically for this purpose. These items, called sublimation blanks, can be purchased online or at many craft and big box stores. Just search for the word "sublimation," or check the tag/ description.

Examples:

- Puzzles with your digital photos
- Personalized mugs

• **T-Shirts** (at least 60% polyester, light color/white fabric recommended) The sublimation printer prints out your image using heat-sensitive ink on special paper. Then, through heat and pressure, the ink of the image is transferred onto an object. This makes the image permanent and durable.

Needed For This Project:

• Object made for sublimation (see examples above)

• The image files you want to use: bring them via USB drive or email

• An appointment with a Digital Services staff member (balibrary.org/ contact-us)

Fees:

The MakerLab charges for sublimation paper: \$1 per 8.5 x 11 sheet or \$2 per 11 x 17 sheet.
